**Students must take General Education courses while taking IECE courses to complete the IECE program in a timely manner.**

IECE 101, IECE 102 and IECE 235 can be taken concurrently.

IECE 180 and IECE 210 are recommended to transfer to MSU 2+2 programs.

The IECE program requires that a student pass a criminal background check; get a TB blood test; and purchase liability insurance through Madisonville Community College.

Term rotation of courses offered:

**Fall Semester:** IECE 101, IECE 102, IECE 130, IECE 180 & IECE 235

**Spring Semester:** IECE 170, IECE 200, IECE 210, IECE 216, IECE 221, IECE 240, IECE 246, IECE 260 & IECE 291

If a student has documentation of current CDA certification; the certificate will exempt student from taking following program courses: IECE 101, IECE 102 and IECE 190.

IECE 291 – prerequisites IECE 101, IECE 102, IECE 120, IECE 130, IECE 140 and IECE 180.

IECE 101 is a prerequisite for IECE 170, IECE 180 and IECE 190.

IECE 101, IECE 102 and a course selected at the discretion of IECE program coordinator is the preparatory coursework toward earning a CDA certification.

*CDA Certificate* prepares someone to be a child care helper at Audubon Head Start.

*IECE AAS Degree* prepares someone to work at Audubon Head Start as an Associate teacher (\$10/hr.).

*IECE BA Degree* prepares someone to be a lead teacher in a preschool.
